The Aldi Scottish Sport Fund is open in areas across Scotland where there is currently an Aldi store. Aldi's goal in providing this programme is to increase the positive impact the company has on local communities and to help as many Scottish sports clubs as possible.

Groups that are successfully selected by the Aldi Scottish Sport Fund judging panel will be entered into their regional prize draw (one prize draw per region) and the winners will be chosen by random draw.

Value Notes

In 2021, Aldi is providing three levels of funding per region:

- One grant of £2,500
- Two grants of £1,000

Who Can Apply

- A religious organisation.

- A charitable service fund of the Armed Forces.
- A Community Interest Company registered with The Office of the Regulator of Community Interest Companies.

Restrictions

The following are not eligible for funding:

- Organisations outside Scotland.
- Political parties.
- Individual sponsorship.
- Travel and accommodation requests.
- Exclusive membership organisations.
- University sports clubs.

Eligible Expenditure

The funding can be used for a number of different things, including:

- The purchase of new team strips.
- The purchase of equipment.
- Subsidising transport costs.

How To Apply

The application windows for 2023 are as follows:

- Central Scotland - 13 March to 23 April.
- North East, Highlands, and Islands - 24 April to 11 June.
- Glasgow and Central West Scotland - 12 June to 16 July.
- Dundee, Tayside, Perth, Kinross and Fife - 18 July to 21 August.
- Edinburgh and the Lothians - 21 August to 24 September.
- South Scotland - 25 September to 29 October.

The completed application form should be submitted by email.

All applications will be considered by the Aldi judging panel.

The Baillie Gifford Grassroots Sports fund supports groups in Scotland to enable sports participation for people of all ages and abilities to improve club sustainability.

Objectives of Fund

The Baillie Gifford Grassroots Sports fund aims to:

- Improve the quality and participation of all ages and abilities in all sports.
- Widen access and remove barriers to participation.
- Improve sustainability of clubs and groups.

Value Notes

Grants up to £5,000 are available towards a maximum total project cost of £20,000.

Grants requested **must** be at least 25% of the total costs.

Match Funding Restrictions

Match funding is required.

Who Can Apply

Grassroots sports organisations can apply and must have:

- An annual income in the most recent financial year of less than £250,000.
- A bank account set up in the name of the group.
- At least three unrelated members on the management committee.
- At least two unrelated cheque signatories.
- Committee meetings with a quorum of at least three unrelated members present.

Restrictions

The following are not eligible for funding:

- Elite sports participation.
- Organisations with an annual income in the most recent financial year of more than £250,000.
- Total project costs over £20,000.
- Statutory organisations.
- Individuals.
- General fundraising appeals or activities.
- Projects which are mainly for the advancement of religion or politics.
- Work in schools, during school/lesson hours.
- Grant requests for less than 25% of the project costs.
- Projects which do not benefit people in Scotland.
- Trips abroad.
- Purchase of secondhand vehicles.
- Retrospective costs.

Eligible Expenditure

Funding is available for core and project costs for the following:

- Purchasing sports equipment.
- Coaching and coaching development costs.
- Facilities hire.
- Encouraging the inclusion of minority groups and those facing barriers to entry.
- General running costs.

How To Apply

Applications can be submitted at any time and decisions take approximately 10 weeks from receipt of application.

An online application form and guidelines are available on Foundation Scotland's website.

Selected Baillie Gifford staff (with support from Foundation Scotland) decides on funding allocation.

Background

The Weir Charitable Trust was established in February 2013 by Chris and Colin Weir, who won £161 million on EuroMillions in July 2011, with an initial endowment of £5 million.

Objectives of Fund

The objective of the Trust is to support groups and charities in Scotland for projects in the areas of sport, recreational facilities, animal welfare, health, and culture.

Value Notes

Funding is at the discretion of the trustees.

The Trust will consider applications for grants of up to £25,000. There is no minimum grant size. The average award granted is £3,500.

The Trust reserves the right to award grants in full or in part depending on its assessment of the merits of the application.

All awards are for one year or less. Successful applicants must wait a calendar year before reapplying for further funding for the same activity. However, applications for further funding within that period may be made if it is not to be used for the same purpose as the original application.

Match Funding Restrictions

100% funding is unlikely, applicants should be able to provide evidence of efforts being made to raise other funds.

Who Can Apply

Applications are accepted from groups and charities that:

- Are based in Scotland providing services in Scotland.
- Are struggling to secure funds through mainstream funders or who have unsuccessfully explored all the statutory sources of funding.
- Have an income of under £125,000 per year.

Non-charitable organisations can apply as long as:

- Their work meets a qualifying category - sport, health, culture, recreational facilities or animal welfare.
- They are seeking less than £25,000.
- They are not a commercial venture or any other group.
- They are not seeking sponsorship.
- They are based and deliver their services in Scotland.

The Trust will now consider applications from community interest companies.

Restrictions

The following are not eligible for funding:

- Small groups or charities with an income of more than £125,000 a year.
- Individuals.
- Commercial ventures, including start ups.
- Governing bodies.
- Requests for amounts over £25,000.
- Requests for sponsorship if fundraising for a charity or good cause.
- Debt reduction, redundancy payments, fees or payouts for legal actions raised against an individual, group or charity.
- Applications for retrospective funding.
- Applications from people based outside Scotland or for activities not carried out in Scotland.
- One-off events such as gala days, exhibitions.
- Capital projects greater than £100,000.
- Community councils, parent teacher associations, Active Schools activities.
- Research.

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- Educational establishments.
 - Public sector bodies.
 - Pilot projects.
 - Multiple applications for same or different projects in the same funding round.
 - Social enterprises.

Eligible Expenditure

Grants are available to support services/projects in the following categories:

- **Sport** - Projects to encourage and increase public participation in sport (eligible activities should involve physical skill and exertion).
- **Recreational facilities** - Providing or organising recreational facilities (buildings, pitches or similar) with the aim of improving the conditions of life for the people for whom the facilities are primarily intended. This is only in relation to facilities which are primarily intended for people who need them due to age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.
- **Animal welfare** - The advancement of animal welfare.
- **Health** - The advancement of health, including prevention or relief of sickness, disease or human suffering.
- **Culture** - Supporting the heritage - tangible or otherwise - of Scotland, through projects that encourage participation in and preservation of Scotland's distinctive culture.

Grants are available for any purpose that provides a benefit to the applicant's target audience.

Examples of eligible activities and costs are as follows:

- Capital projects (such as equipment, fixtures, fittings and refurbishments).
- One-off projects.
- Running costs.
- Core costs.
- Salaries.

How To Apply

Applications are considered twice a year, in May and November, with the closing dates for applications at the end of February and the end of August.

The next deadlines for application are:

- 31 August 2023.
- 29 February 2024.

Funding is available for projects that give opportunities to those who wish to fulfil their sporting ambitions, at any level.

Boost has awarded grants across a very wide spectrum of sports projects and in three focus areas of hardship:

- Financial.
- Physical, mental or medical impairment.
- Social exclusion.

How To Apply

This is a rolling programme and applications may be submitted at any time by email or by post.

There is no formal application form.

Eligible applicants must submit their bid, no more than two sides of A4, detailing:

- Name of organisation, what the organisation does and list of beneficiaries.
- Reason for seeking funding, details of the project and approximate funding requirements.

Background

The Jordan Sinnott Foundation Trust provide grants to clubs, community groups and teams to support vulnerable and underprivileged children and young adults aged 5-21 years to access healthy recreation and sport so they can develop their capabilities and achieve their potential.

Objectives of Fund

The funding aims to support the Trust's objectives which are:

- The relief of those who are in need, particularly children and young people, by reason of sickness or disability, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances, including by the provision of grants to fund items such as sports equipment, club membership or training facilities for those who cannot afford them.
- To help young people, by means of sport and healthy recreation, to develop their capabilities and fulfil their potential as individuals and members of society.

The current funding priorities are:

- Individuals, in order to fund access to sports and to enable them to further their progress in sport where they cannot afford it.
- Grass-roots sports teams for young persons, as long as they are organisations that are registered charities or CASCs.
- Projects that enable social inclusion for young persons in need through sport and healthy recreation.

Value Notes

The following grants are available:

- Individual grants of up to £2,000.
- Clubs/groups or teams - grants of up to £5,000.

Only when there are sufficient funds available will the Charity Trustees award grants to fund up to 100% of the cost of a proposal.

Who Can Apply

Applications are accepted from clubs, community groups and teams in the UK.

The Trust prioritises applications that are for those that are vulnerable, underprivileged, especially those challenged by abuse; addiction; those who are young carers; those who find themselves in transition and those without a place to call home.

Eligible Expenditure

Grants are to enable organisations to build capacity; achieve sustainability; increase their reach and support and develop their vision.

Grants can be used for the following:

- Purchasing sports equipment, kit and gear.
- Transport costs.
- Club membership.

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- Sports specific coaching education/training.

Background

The Hargreaves Foundation is a grant-making charitable foundation set up in 2020 by Peter Hargreaves and his family. Peter Hargreaves co-founded Hargreaves Lansdown, a financial services firm, and remains the single largest shareholder of the firm. The Foundation is funded through a transfer of shares held by Peter Hargreaves totalling around £100 million, with the intention of adding additional funding over time.

Objectives of Fund

The funding is intended for projects that give those under the age of 18, and living with a mental health condition, disability, or growing up in poverty, the opportunity to fulfil their potential, improving wellbeing, self-esteem and independence.

Value Notes

Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees.

The Foundation aims to distribute a total of around £2 million in grants per year. There is no minimum or maximum grant size.

Last year, a total of £335,341 was distributed to 12 organisations.

Who Can Apply

Organisations from across the UK are eligible, but priority will be given to organisations based in and/or working in the South West.

The following organisations can apply:

- Registered Charities or Charitable Incorporated Organisations.
- Schools and Further Education Colleges (usually exempt charities).
- NHS Trusts.

To be eligible for funding organisations must:

- Be low risk with a formal structure.
- Have at least one set of published accounts at the point of applying.
- Have a bank account in the organisation's name with at least two unconnected signatories.

Restrictions

The following are not eligible for funding:

- Individuals.
- Social Enterprises.
- Community Interest Companies.
- Private Companies.
- Local Authorities.
- Crisis funding.
- Core funding.

- Retrospective costs.

Eligible Expenditure

The Foundation's objectives are underpinned by the desire to give those under the age of 18, and living with a mental health problem, physical disability, or growing up in poverty, the opportunity to fulfil their potential whilst improving wellbeing, self-esteem and independence.

The Foundation can fund clearly defined projects, initiatives or the purchase of specific items that support one or more of the following:

- Enables individuals to experience the mental and physical health benefits of participatory sport
- Ensures participatory sport is accessible
- Provides sporting or educational activities that foster life skills
- Aims to improve academic engagement and attainment
- Encourages the development of skills and personal attributes to aid future employability

Background

SportScotland is the national agency dedicated to promoting sporting opportunities for all Scottish people at all levels, whatever their interest and ability. Set up by Royal Charter in 1972 as the Scottish Sports Council, the name changed to SportScotland in 1999.

Objectives of Fund

The Sports Facilities Fund aims to support capital projects that provide opportunities for people to get involved in and participate in sport and physical activity in Scotland.

Value Notes

Grants of to 50% of eligible project costs up to a maximum of £200,000 may be awarded.

A higher percentage of investment can be awarded to community led projects within or serving the most deprived areas (Deciles 1 and 2 on the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation up to 75% of eligible project costs, up to a maximum of £250,000

Match Funding Restrictions

The remainder of the project finance should come from the organisation's own cash, fundraising, in-kind contributions or can be sourced from other grant funders. Local authority applicants should meet at least 25% of the total project cost from their capital budget.

Who Can Apply

Applications will be considered from any non-profit distributing, constituted organisations whose membership is open to all sections of society.

Eligible organisations include:

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- Clubs (existing and new).
 - Local authorities or leisure trusts.
 - Charitable and third sector organisations.
 - Community organisations.
 - Community sport hubs.
 - Scottish governing bodies of sport(s).
 - Educational establishments providing access for clubs or community use.

Applicants should demonstrate:

- How the project will deliver key local outcomes and what measures will be used to demonstrate the impact on local communities.
- A clear demand for the facility development.
- A clear financial need for our investment, our funding cannot be used to replace other investment.
- The project is financially viable in capital and revenue terms. This must be supported by a fully costed plan and funding profile for the project.
- Security of tenure for at least 20 years (from the date of project completion).
- A sustainable operational plan for the facility (including management, programming, and staffing).
- A safeguarding policy for the organisation and operations.

Eligible Expenditure

Funding is for projects that achieve the following outcomes:

- Provide opportunities for more people to be more active more often.
- Widen access, provide opportunities, and remove barriers to participation for some or all the following groups:
 - Those who currently do not participate in sport or physical activity.
 - Those who share any protected characteristics (age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex, sexual orientation, marriage and civil partnership and pregnancy and maternity).
 - Those living in areas of socio-economic disadvantage, poverty, or low income.
 - Those living in rural communities.
 - Young people.
 - Older adults.
 - Women and girls.
 - Care experienced young people.
- Provide high quality and diverse opportunities that develop participants, athletes, volunteers, coaches and officials.
- Promote the physical and mental health, and wellbeing benefits of sport and physical activity and the wider social benefits.
- Are designed to the highest possible standard for sport and physical activity, inclusion and accessibility.
- Are designed to use sustainable construction methods, materials or energy systems and form part of a wider organisational sustainability strategy or plan.

Support is available for the following types of activities:

- New, upgraded or extended sports facilities.
 - Inclusive changing facilities.
 - Facilities that provide or improve access for outdoor sport and adventure activities.
 - Floodlights that increase capacity at appropriate sports facilities.
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- Facilities that support community sports hubs or community activity within schools.
 - Facilities that enable **sport**scotland institute of sport or UK sport performance sport programmes.
 - Major items of non-personal sports equipment.

Greater prioritisation will be given to projects and applications supporting Return to Support objectives and outcomes following the coronavirus pandemic. As well as those that can clearly demonstrate an embedded inclusive approach such as Changing Lives Through Sport and Physical Activity and target participants in/from SIMD areas or Disability, BAME or other protected characteristic groups.

How To Apply

There are two annual deadlines: 1 April and 1 September. SportScotland aim to make a decision within three months from the submission deadline date.

Background

The Peter Harrison Foundation was founded in 1999 by Mr Peter Harrison. In October 2000 the Harrison family gifted £30 million as a capital endowment to the Foundation and contributed a further £15 million in 2010. Since opening the PHF has awarded nearly £50 million to projects across the UK.

Objectives of Fund

The aim of the scheme is to support sports projects which provide opportunities for self-development for people in the UK who are disabled or otherwise disadvantaged.

Value Notes

Two levels of funding are available:

- Major grants - £5,000 to £30,000.
- Small grants - up to £5,000 (for organisations with a turnover of up to £500,000).

The foundation provides single year or multi-year funding.

Match Funding Restrictions

Match funding is not a specified requirement.

Who Can Apply

The Foundation accepts applications from organisations working throughout the UK that are:

Objectives of Fund

Background

The Lawn Tennis Association (LTA) is the national governing body for tennis in Great Britain, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man. It is responsible for developing and promoting the sport, safeguarding the integrity of tennis, and helping as many people as possible to play and enjoy tennis and padel by making them relevant, accessible and welcoming. Ensuring local communities have access to quality facilities is critical to attracting and retaining more players.

Objectives of Fund

The quick access loan funding is for constituted organisations in Great Britain that want to enhance their venues' facilities with the aim of increasing the number of local people playing tennis.

The objectives of the scheme are to:

- Provide indoor or foodlit and year round playing facilities to encourage community accessible play all year.
- Retain and increase the number of participants at the venue.
- Offer and increase non-member pay and play usage and coaching opportunities.
- Grow the numbers of adults and juniors on the coaching programme.
- Provide seamless booking of tennis courts and lessons through an online booking system.

Value Notes

A range of interest-free loans are available for capital improvements with a minimum value of £25,000 (see scheme guidance for LTA's funding framework).

Depending on level of funding requested, the LTA will aim to take security unless this is not possible (facility is council or educational establishment):

- For loans of £100,000 and above a legal charge will be sought on the land.
- For loans between £50,000 and £100,000 a restriction will be sought on the land.
- For loans from £25,001 to £49,999 no charge or restriction will be sought.

Match Funding Restrictions

Applicants will be expected to contribute towards the cost of the project through reserves, accessing other funding sources and fundraising eg crowd funder.

Who Can Apply

Applications are accepted from people, committees and organisations that:

- Are committed to growing tennis by opening up access at their venue.
- Are effectively engaging their community.
- Have the skills to deliver their project.

To be eligible:

- Venues must be LTA-registered upon project completion.
- There must be an adequate security of tenure at the venue, with the applicant legally able to borrow money.
- Online booking for courts and programmes must be available through the LTA online booking system.
- Venues will need to develop a satisfactory sustainability action plan.
- Venues will need to have in place an adequate sinking fund.
- Venues must be properly constituted, not for profit, inclusive and accessible.

Location

Great Britain

Restrictions

The following are not eligible for funding:

- Companies limited by shares.
- Routine maintenance.
- Clubhouse construction or renovations.
- Like-for-like court resurfacing.
- Purchase of land for a venue.
- Funding new venues/organisations without financial history, eg two years of accounts.
- Retrospective funding for previously carried out works.

Eligible Expenditure

Loans are to support venues investment in tennis and padel facilities, prioritising the installation and construction of covered courts.

Funding is available for:

- Lighting upgrades to LED (outdoor and indoor).
- New floodlights.
- New court provision.
- Outdoor padel.
- Covered padel (court and cover).
- Covered tennis court.

Applicants must demonstrate how the wider community will benefit from the investment:

- **Pay and play** - venues should ensure daily opportunities for non-members to book courts at peak and off-peak times.
- **Coaching** - affordable coaching opportunities and programmes should be accessible to non-members and members.
- **Community outreach** - venues should work with local schools and coaches to deliver opportunities and open access events for pupils and members of the local community.

How To Apply

Applications can be made at any time and decisions will be communicated within six weeks of application.

Funding is provided by The Dan Maskell Tennis Trust, a tennis charity that raises funds for people with disabilities.

Objectives of Fund

The Trust offers small grants to help disabled people to play tennis through the purchase of wheelchairs, tennis equipment and grants for coaching.

Value Notes

Grants of up to £1,500 for a group, club or project are available. Up to £500 is available for individuals.

Match Funding Restrictions

Organisations must make a contribution towards the purchase of wheelchairs.

Who Can Apply

Disability groups and programmes, clubs, schools and associations in the UK are eligible to apply. Individuals are also eligible to apply.

Grant applications for the same purpose are accepted every three years.

Location

United Kingdom

Restrictions

Items considered as luxury items, such as electrical equipment, clothing, holdalls or individual transport costs will not be considered.

Publicity, promotions, advertising, general administration and catering at tournaments and events are not within the criteria for grant aid.

Sound balls are not available for individuals.

Eligible Expenditure

Applications can be made for the following:

- Wheelchairs - group, club or project applications can be made for ROMA tennis wheelchairs designed for general use at grassroots level. A contribution of £250 per chair is required, and the Trust will offer a grant for the remaining cost. There may also be a delivery charge, which must be met by the applicant.
- Wheelchairs - individual applications: available to individuals who play wheelchair tennis. Currently only applications for ROMA wheelchairs are available. The applicant must raise a contribution of £250. For alternative wheelchairs, a grant may be awarded and the applicant will be responsible for ordering and payment of the chair directly with the supplier.
- Bag of equipment: these bags will be ordered and paid for by the Trust and delivered direct to a specified address. Kit bags will include rackets, balls, mini net, and coaching aids such as cones and throw down marker lines. Sound balls for visually impaired groups may also be applied for. These kits are suitable for groups, clubs and disability programmes.
- Grants are available for starting a disability group, a club programme or a project or help with an existing project or programme. Examples of items that will be considered under this scheme are help towards court hire, coaching fees, equipment (if not applying for a kit bag as above). All programmes and projects should aim towards self-financing and sustainability.
- Individual applications -items considered in this category would be tennis rackets for which a maximum grant of £100 per racket may be offered, strings, tape and gloves for wheelchair players. Coaching lessons

with an LTA Licensed coach and course fees for official LTADevelopment/Coaching courses are also available.

How To Apply

Applications are assessed four times per year. The remaining application deadlines are:

- 13 June 2023 (for the meeting on 26 July 2023).
- 22 October 2023 (for the meeting on 20 November 2023).

Before applying for assistance, applicants are advised to consult The Lawn Tennis Association and/or their local County Tennis Association.

- Organisations that currently have National Lottery Awards for All funding.
- Organisations that don't have at least two people on their board or committee who aren't married, in a long-term relationship, living together at the same address, or related by blood.
- One organisation on behalf of another.
- Projects to improve school facilities or equipment.
- Projects to help with staff training.

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- Projects that are part of the school curriculum.
 - Projects that involve activities the school should already be providing (eg, a project teaching literacy during school hours).
 - Projects that take place during teaching times (however, projects during lunch breaks, or before and after school might be eligible).
 - Alcohol.
 - Contingency costs, loans, endowments or interest.
 - Electricity generation and feed-in tariff payments.
 - Political or religious activities.
 - Profit-making/fundraising activities.
 - VAT that can be reclaimed.
 - Statutory activities.
 - Overseas travel.

Eligible Expenditure

The funding is for projects/activities that achieve one or more of the following outcomes:

- Bring people together and build strong relationships in and across communities.
- Improve the places and spaces that matter to communities.
- Enable more people to fulfil their potential by working to address issues at the earliest possible stage.

Funding for sports projects will be prioritised for projects that:

The funding can be used for a wide range of costs, including but not limited to:

- Small land or capital projects.
- Staff costs.
- Training costs.
- Transport.

In 2023, funding is available for:

- **Organisations that are facing increased demands and challenges as a result of the cost-of-living crisis. Groups should contact NLCF to discuss any related projects further.**
